# FINANCIAL TIPS AND PLANNING

Financial Awareness

What are your first thoughts when it comes to Finances? Finances have many more elements other than just making and spending money. EARLY FINANCIAL EDUCATION IS CRITICAL EVEN BEFORE YOU START A JOB OR HAVE CURRENT OR FUTURE SOURCES OF INCOME. However, it is never too late to learn to make sound financial decisions.

Do you know the difference between gross earnings and net earnings also referred to as "after taxes"?

Gross earnings is the amount of money you earn before any taxes or withholdings are taken out of your check. "Net Earnings" or "take home pay" is the amount you actually receive on your check once the required taxes are taken out. This information is important when creating a budget.





BUDGETING! Budgeting is the number one important factor when it comes to your money. Start with how much money you make for the month after taxes. Now, as a guide, you can use the **50/30/20 Rule** - 50% for your needs, 30% for your wants and 20% for savings. Necessities include rent, utilities, phone, car, insurance. Keep in mind, a luxury car is not a need, it is a want.

## WHY DO YOU NEED A BUDGET?

You need a budget so you can track your income and expenses, make sound financial decisions and plan for your future. You also want to make sure that you have enough money each month to cover your expenses and are not living paycheck to paycheck.

AVOID GETTING INTO DEBT. You don't need the best of everything. Having the biggest house, the most expensive cars, designer clothes, the latest gadgets and electronic may sound appealing, but in the long run accumulating so much debt is the worst thing you can do. Getting out of debt is hard.

You do not need to be in competition with others to see who's car is better or who's house is bigger. Why go broke to impress others?

### **Credit Card Debt:**

practice self-control - If you are just starting out as a young adult, you will find it can be easy to get a credit card or several credit cards. Although credit is important, being responsible is key! It is easy to accumulate or max out a credit card.

We buy things we don't need with money we don't have to impress people we don't like.

Think about it — while you can simply swipe a card to buy something with your credit card, just know that you will be paying interest on your purchases, anywhere from 18-25% or sometimes more. If you practice self-control by not using your credit card for every little purchase you want, you won't be paying for everything 10 years down the line. You do not need multiple cards. Getting into debt can happen overnight, and difficult to get out.



# GETTING READY TO PURCHASE A CAR?

Know your facts before you make a purchase. Car salesmen are not your friends. Their job is to sell you a car; not to care about you as a person or try to get you the best deal. They only care about closing the deal and making money off the purchase. A lot of salesmen take advantage of the buyer (especially first time buyers). If you are buying new, **READ** the contract. New car dealers often put unnecessary things in the contract that could cost you thousands of dollars and high interest. **QUESTION EVERYTHING**. Ask about a first time buyers program.

If you are buying used, check the car facts. You want to know if there are any recalls, if the vehicle was in any accidents and has a maintenance log. Ask for an extended warranty as that may come in handy. Don't make a rash decision. Walk away and think about your purchase.



When purchasing a car, shop around first and don't make an impulse purchase. Be practical. Do not have them run your credit UNTIL you find the right choice for your. Having your credit ran multiple times at the same or different car lots will bring your credit score down and interest up.

### **Financial Tip:**

Always check the amount of interest you will be paying on a car loan. Ask about the interest rate and what interest you will be paying back during the life of the loan. You do not want to pay double or triple for car because of high interest.

For instance, \$15k loan with 5% interest over 5 years will cost you \$1,984 in total interest.

Total cost of the vehicle is \$16,984.00

The same loan at 20% will cost you \$8,844 in interest. Total cost of the vehicle is now \$23,844. The more the vehicle cost, the more you pay back. Can you imagine if the car was \$30k or higher?


